National Sugar Shake Program

The Committee is reviewing a proposal for a National Sugar Shake Program. A national program benefits jurisdictions who require sugar shake activities to be conducted as part of the Code, and raise awareness for the importance of hive inspections for exotic mites. A suitable seasonal timing for the National Sugar Shake Program is being identified.

Harmonisation of entry requirements

The Subcommittee on Domestic Quarantine and Market Access (SDQMA) and Industry continue to work together to identify endemic bee pests that are regulated for interstate movement of honey and bee products. SDQMA are also reviewing the Australian Interstate Quarantine website to ensure information presented on honey bees and/or product movement is relevant and informative.

The Committee

The Committee includes representatives from the Australian Government, the state and territory government, the Australian Honey Bee Industry Council (AHBIC), and Plant Health Australia (PHA). It was formed to oversee and support Bee Biosecurity Officers, as well as providing guidance and support for jurisdictional implementation and industry assistance with The Honey Bee Biosecurity Code of Practice.
